

Rescue Units Needed in Madagascar

I want to share something concerning some girls and a boy who are one family and they are immigrants from D.R. Congo. The mother and the children fled the Congo due to the civil war there and they were heading to Madagascar. While coming to Madagascar they wanted to proceed towards France by water using a ship. Since they did not have proper documents to travel with, the immigrations officers of Madagascar apprehended the mother and she was taken by the officers. The children were taken into custody by some of the officers.

We were in the office getting visas. An officer who was helping us to get the visas asked if we understood the Swahili language because they could not understand or communicate with the Congolese. My wife said she could speak that language and we went to see the children. My wife asked them and they explained everything to her and she translated to the officers. The kids said they had stayed three days and had been there without food. We bought a bag of rice 50 kg, meat, and cooking oil for them and we prayed for them. My wife asked about the mother and the children didn't know where she was taken.

After a week, we received a call from the police and they told us that the mother was waiting to appear in court soon. They asked if we knew of any place where these girls can stay?

They asked if Teen Missions could take care of the children. We decided to go see them. We were told to go to the court to see the magistrate judge. We were given the conditions about taking care of them. We said we can not sign to those conditions, we just wanted to help the children. If we had Rescue Units, we could have been allowed to take them without any conditions.

We took them to one of the centers where they keep children without parents and we cried over the situation we found and the children refused to remain there. We had no options but to encourage them to be strong. We asked about the food and they told us that they rely on well wishers to donate food for them, the government does not supply any food for them. We went the following day and bought food for them. We were told that we cook food for everyone because everyone is equal in the eyes of God.

So, God-willing, we need Rescue Units here in Madagascar. These are pictures of two little babies who were thrown by the mothers after being born. They picked them and brought them to this place. We bought diapers for them and prayed for them. We thank God for what He is doing to show us what is going on in this country.

Pray for God to bless our Madagascar staff as they are the hands and feet of Jesus.
